Proper Disposal of Unused Prescription Drugs

Federal prescription drug disposal guidelines urge Americans to follow the instructions listed below when disposing of prescription drugs:

Take unused, unneeded, or expired prescription drugs out of their original containers.

Mix the prescription drugs with an undesirable substance, like used coffee grounds or kitty litter and put them in impermeable, nondescript containers, such as empty cans or sealable bags, further ensuring that the drugs are not diverted or accidentally ingested by children or pets.

Throw these containers in the trash.

OR

CVS, Walgreens, Rite-Aid, Kroger and Winn-Dixie sell pre-paid postage envelopes (\$3.99) that allow customers to mail unwanted prescription and over-the-counter medications to Sharp Compliance's Texas facility for disposal. Controlled substances are excluded from the program.

Disposal Tips for Sharps

The suggested disposal for residents with Sharps (needles, syringes, lancets) is as follows:

1. Place all sharps in a puncture-resistant, hard plastic container. An empty detergent container or empty coffee can will do. Disinfect with a small amount of bleach.
2. Seal the lid with heavy duty tape and place in with your trash with this label on it.

Important Reminders:

- 1) Fill the sharps container with only used injector pens and/or syringes.
- 2) Used sharps must be disposed of properly to prevent injury.
(DO NOT place in household trash)
- 3) **DO NOT OVERFILL!**
- 4) **DO NOT** place hazardous or radioactive contaminated medical waste or waste in this container system.
- 5) Total residual fluid allowed is limited to 50 ml.
- 6) Total weight per container system is limited to 10 pounds for the 1-gallon sharps mailback system and 3 pounds for the 1.4 quart sharps mailback system.

Sharps Medical Waste, for USPS purposes, means "a medical waste object that is capable of cutting or penetrating skin or packaging material and that is contaminated with a pathogen or may become contaminated with a pathogen derived from the medical treatment, diagnosis, immunization, or biomedical research of a human or animal. Sharps include used medical waste such as needles, syringes, scalpels, broken glass, culture slides, culture dishes, broken capillary tubes, broken rigid plastic, and exposed ends of dental wires."

- Medication/Pharmaceutical Waste
- Compressed Gas Cylinders, Canisters, Inhalers, and Aerosol Cans
- Garbage
- Hazardous and Chemical Waste
- Radioactive Waste
- Fixatives and Preservatives
- Pathological Waste
- Any devices or solutions containing mercury or other heavy metals
